Justine Man, a 9 year-old student at Wade Park School in Cleveland, Ohio, is being recognized by Suntex International, Inc. for an amazing academic accomplishment. Since September 2012, students enrolled in Suntex's First in Math program, have been competitively earning math stickers in their respective math accounts. Suntex International closed the 2012-13 contest on April 30, 2013. Justine Man has 37,117 stickers which earned her #1 in the entire Cleveland City School System, #1 in the State of Ohio, #23 in the United States (which is #6 in the United States among 4th grade contestants).

First in Math is an online mathematics program with interactive math activities which were designed to sharpen students' mental math skills. Each school year, Suntex International tracks the earnings of students and posts high scores on their website and updates the earnings each night.

The idea and the website belong to Robert Sun. Miss Man frequently earned her class's Player of the Day award by outearning fellow classmates each evening prior. Students may continue to play and earn stickers until the end of July 2013. Her current score is 37,802, which represents more than 57% of her team's score. Amazingly, Justine has managed to earn more than 1/8 of Wade Park School's 276,367 total stickers, with over 415 students playing. When asked what her favorite First in Math games were, Justine said, "Monu's Path and Monuji's Path." First in Math is a compilation of some fifty animated and interactive math activities.

Both CMSD Chief Executive Eric Gordon and Elizabeth Nelson, the CMSD's Mathematics Department Head, have acknowledged Justine Man for her outstanding efforts in First in Math. Man's father originally asked Justine to work hard and earn recognition in First in Math to give her a positive voice in school. CLEVELAND, Ohio -- One of the first Cleveland police officers to arrive at the Seymour Avenue house where Amanda Berry, Gina DeJesus and Michelle Knight were being held was Patrol Officer Anthony Espada.

He was interviewed this weekend by the department's public information officer and a post of his account went up Monday evening on the Cleveland police Facebook page.

The patrol car that Espada and his partner (who was not identified) were in happened to be near Seymour Avenue, so he responded to a dispatcher who said, "Female on line stating Amanda Berry - 10 years," the dispatcher then adding that she was still on the line, "giving info about captor, Ariel Castro." "We pull up, we see a crowd, like on the porch," Espada recalled. "We see this girl. She's like raising her hand, holding a child. I'm looking at my partner - 'Is it her?'" His partner, who was driving, said, "I can't tell."

Berry approached the car on the driver's side. "He looked up at me and he's like, 'It is her.' Just the emotion from that, that he confirmed it was Amanda, was overwhelming."

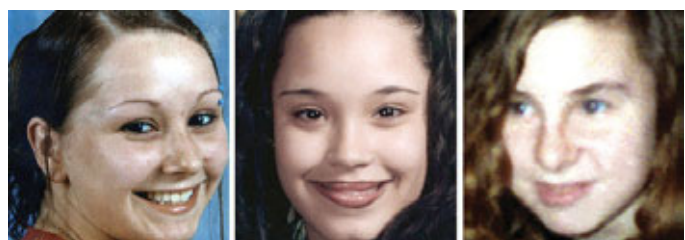
The patrol officers thought Castro might still be in the house, because Berry was pointing at it. "My partner asked if anyone was still inside. [Berry] said, 'Yes. Gina DeJesus and another girl.'"

"And it was like another bombshell with overwhelming force just hit me. I believe I broadcasted, 'Gina might still be in the house.'"

The officers ran toward the house. "As we were going up the steps it was so quiet, like, peaceful. ... Then you

hear this scuffling ... and it was Michelle. She kinda popped out into the doorway and paused there for a second. I mean, within moments she came charging at me.

"She jumped onto me. She's like, 'You saved us! You saved us!'"

"And I'm holding her so tight. And then within a few seconds I see another girl come out of the bedroom. I just look at her. I ... You can immediately tell who it is. And I asked her, 'What is your name?' She said, 'My name is Georgina DeJesus.'"

found them! We found them!"

"It couldn't have gotten any better than that, that day," he said. "I don't feel like a hero. I'm just glad I was there, you know, just making sure they were safe. I feel so happy for them. It is just unbelievable. It goes through my mind every day."

Police arrested Ariel Castro the day the women were rescued. He was later charged with four counts of kidnapping and three counts of rape in connection with holding the three women for the last decade.

and after meeting with him Tuesday they don't see him that way. Weintraub says it's unfair and offensive that "the media and the community want to demonize this man before they know the whole story."

Schlachet says details of Castro's innocence "will be disclosed as the case progresses."

Weintraub also says Castro "loves dearly" the child he fathered with alleged kidnapping victim Amanda Berry while she was in captivity.

Castro is charged with kidnapping and raping Berry, Gina DeJesus and Michelle Knight.

Attorneys Craig Weintraub and Jay Schlachet tell WKYC Channel 3 that suspect Ariel Castro has been portrayed as a "monster" in the media,
