Biography



Qing Yang's career has spanned more than two decades and the continents of Asia, Europe, and North America. Born in Manchuria during the Cultural Revolution, she moved to Beijing in 1980 for intensive study at the China Conservatory. In 1989, as a college junior at the conservatory, Qing was one of the first participants in the Tiananmen Square Democracy Movement. Upon graduation, Qing was invited to join the China Central Opera Orchestra, an ensemble with whom she toured Asia, her performances broadcast frequently on China Central Television.

After moving to New York City in 1995, Qing performed with numerous contemporary music ensembles and Juilliard School faculty, appearing at such venues as Columbia University, the 92nd Street Y, and the United Nations. At this time, she also appeared on Danish television in collaboration with the Scandinavian Jazz Quartet. Qing subsequently has been engaged by numerous summer festivals, including Aspen, contemporary music festivals in Cincinnati, and the Opera Theatre and Music Festival of Lucca (Italy). Her performances have also been featured regularly on WCLV-FM in Cleveland.

Qing holds the Bachelor's in Music degree from the China Conservatory in Beijing, a Master's of Music from Ohio University, and is currently a doctoral candidate at the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music. She has studied cello with Lee Fiser, Yehuda Hanani, Richard Aaron, and David Geber, and received chamber music coaching by Jean Barr and the Tokyo String Quartet. Reflecting her ongoing interest in the development of Western music in China, Qing has been invited to perform and give master classes in Beijing, Shenyang, and Shanghai the coming year. Qing has taught at Hiram College since 2004, and recently joined the string faculty at West Reserve Academy and Westminster College.

Vice President Cheney: "Our Administration Rejects Any Attempt To Short-Circuit The Rights Of Workers"

Remarks At The National Association Of Manufacturers Breakfast Meeting

Washington, D.C. February 14, 2007

THE VICE PRESIDENT: " America is also a country that takes very seriously the right of men and women



to work, and to organize within the law. The American labor movement has a proud history and has long reflected a basic principle of our democracy: fair elections decided by secret ballots. This principle will be put to a test in Congress this year. It's important for everyone in the debate to remember that secret ballots protect workers from intimidation, and ensure the integrity of the process.

"Beyond that, if workers do decide to form a union, they and their employer should be able to negotiate without having terms forced on them. Our administration rejects any attempt to short-circuit the rights of workers. We will defend their right to vote yes or no by secret ballot, and their right to fair bargaining. H.R. 800 violates these principles, and if it is sent to the President, he will veto the bill."

Mayor Frank Jackson to Give State of the City Address to The City Club of Cleveland



CLEVELAND, OH—The Honorable Frank Jackson, mayor of the City of Cleveland, will give his State of the City address at noon on Thursday, March 1, 2007, to The City Club of Cleveland.

The Special Forum will be held at the Crowne Plaza Hotel, 777 St. Clair Avenue, Cleveland.

A native Clevelander, Jackson attended public schools, earned his associates degree at Cuyahoga Community College, and earned his bachelors, masters and law degrees at Cleveland State University. He was elected to the Cleveland City Council in 1989 to represent Ward 5 and also served as chair of the Community and Economic Development Committee during the White administration. In 2002, Jackson was elected by the 21-member City Council to serve as City Council president. In November 2005, he was elected to serve as Cleveland's 56th mayor.
